**FEAST OF THE ANNUNCIATION – March 25**

It was only through Mary that God the Father gave his only-begotten Son to the world. Whatever sighs the patriarchs may have sent forth, whatever prayers the prophets and the saints of the Old Covenant may have offered up to obtain this treasure for four thousand years, it was only Mary who merited it and found grace before God by the force of her prayers and eminence of her virtues. God the Son descended into her virginal womb as the New Adam into his terrestrial paradise, to take his pleasure there, and to work in secret marvels of grace.

*Eternal Memory - Asking God to Remember*

Our best-known Byzantine prayer for the deceased is a mere two words: “*Eternal Memory.*” The meaning of these words comes directly from the Scriptures. When the Old Testament describes God intervening in the lives of His people to save them, we often see the expression “God remembered so-and-so.” God remembered Noah and brought the flood to an end. God remembered His covenant with Abraham and began the Exodus. The prayer “Eternal Memory” entrusts the departed soul to the care of God and asks that God’s plan of salvation be fully realized for him or her. The Lord has created each one of us to share His life and love forever. The Good Thief crucified next to Jesus asked, “Remember me when You come into Your kingdom.” Jesus replied, “Today you will be with me in Paradise.” This is what we ask for our beloved departed when we pray “Eternal Memory.”
