PASCHAL TROPARION: Christ is risen from the dead! By death he trampled death; and to those in the tombs he granted life.

FEAST OF ST. GEORGE - April 23

George, a Captain in the Roman Army, tore up in defiance an edict of Emperor Diocletian ordering the persecution of Christians. He battled the devil, symbolized by the dragon, and saved the Holy church, symbolized by the king's daughter shown in a number of icons. He rides a white horse that indicates God's grace carrying him to the heroism of martyrdom. Constantine the Great built a great church over his tomb in Lyda of Palestine. The name George means "Tiller of the Earth.

Imitating Christ

A very simplistic view of Christianity goes something like this: "I follow Christ. He rewards me by keeping my earthly body safe from all harm, my earthly mind clear of all troubles. He keeps my belly and my wallet full. It's easy being a Christian! I'm good to God and He pays me back by being good to me!" However, it's not like that at all.

To be a true Christian means to realize that just as Christ suffered and died, so too will we, His followers, also suffer and ultimately die. God will protect us – but that protection is meant for our immortal souls – those souls for which Jesus died on the cross so that we might not perish, but have eternal life with Him.

No one likes to suffer, but all of us must endure it. Even those who appear not to suffer can be afflicted with pain and turmoil not visible to the naked eye. In addition, suffering can also be eternal when the soul that has not obeyed God is detached from Him forever.

As Christians, we must embrace the crosses of our lives and see them as a way of emulating the Master. If imitation is the sincerest form of flattery, then we must want to imitate Christ's suffering to receive the crown – through no merit of our own – that awaits those who persevere until the end.

ASTROLOGY & HOROSCOPES – NOT FOR CHRISTIANS

When someone asks me what my "sign" is, I love to reply by drawing the sign of the cross on a piece of paper and saying, "This is the sign I was born under, baptized under, live by, and will die by." Not the sign of Aquarius but the sign of the cross. The sign of the One "who loved me and gave Himself for me;" the sign of the One who cares for me and guides me. It is Him I consult each day through prayer and His word in the Bible – not the stars.

It is no wonder then that the Bible condemns astrology. It condemns it because it is idolatry. It attributes to planets and stars the power that belongs to God alone. It tries to find the will of God by other means than what God has appointed, that is, the Bible and the Church.
