A LOVING AND JUST GOD

When we think of Jesus, we have a tendency to think of a man of peace. After all, it is He who told His disciples, "Blessed are the peacemakers: they shall be called sons of God" (Matthew 5:9). We picture The Good Shepherd, tenderly holding the lambs (signifying us) in His arms. We embrace the image of Jesus knocking at the door (signifying our hearts).

However, Jesus had a just side as well. He was angered by injustice, especially towards the poor and downtrodden. He was upset with hypocrites who loved to tell others how to lead their lives, but then neglected to live just and loving lives. This is the same Jesus Who drove the moneychangers out of the Temple and cursed the fig tree for not bearing fruit!

Let us be merciful people, full of compassion for the downtrodden and the sinner. Let us not view ourselves as superior to others because of our own efforts, but let us beat our chests and pray, "Lord, Jesus Christ, Son of the Loving God be merciful to me, a sinner."

It's Better to Give

We believe that we are hurt when we don't receive love. But that is not what hurts us. Our pain comes when we do not give love. We were born to love. You might say that we are divinely created love machines. We function most powerfully when we are giving love.
