PASCHAL TROPARION: Christ is risen from the dead! By death he trampled death; and to those in the tombs he granted life.

ASCENSION OF OUR LORD – May 9

This Holy Day always falls on a Thursday, forty days after Pascha (Easter). After Jesus had resurrected from the dead, He showed Himself to many with proof of His divinity as He walked, taught, and ate with His apostles here on earth for forty days to encourage them.

On this Holy Day of Ascension Jesus took His Mother and the apostles to the top of Mt. Olive. On the way, He continued to strengthen them. His last instructions were for them all to return to Jerusalem.

He said, "There you shall receive the power from on high. The Holy Spirit will descend upon you, and you shall be witness unto me starting in Jerusalem and in all of Judea, Samaria, and even to the uttermost parts of the earth!"

Jesus then blessed them for the last time saying, "Observe all that I have commanded you, and behold, I am with you always, even to the end of time."

Then there came a bright cloud from heaven, and He was carried away on it to heaven. As they kept looking up, two men, as angels, dressed in all white, stood beside them saying, "This same Jesus you see ascending into heaven, He shall come again, as He promised." When they turned to leave, the angels were gone. They returned to Jerusalem, to await the promise of the coming of Holy Spirit.

Matching Words with Actions

The Christian life must be one where what comes out of the mouth matches the actions of the person. God wants both our words and actions to reflect our discipleship. This is not an easy task, and one, I dare say, that probably few people ever achieve. Only with the Lord to guide our thoughts and actions can we even imagine this to happen! However, it is not an impossible task, for God will give us the strength and perseverance to follow through with it.

We match our words and actions when we reflect on them. Sometimes we react, rather than act. If we stop, think, and then act, we will have more continuity in our lives. If we are reactionary, it is quite possible that we will appear to others to be hypocrites, and this is what Jesus warned His disciples not to become. Jesus tells them, "Good people draw what is good from the store of goodness in their hearts; bad people draw what is bad from the store of badness. For the words of the mouth flow out of what fills the heart" (Luke 6:45). May we strive to draw from the goodness of our hearts and may our words and actions reflect the goodness of the Lord in all we say and do.
