JESUS PRAYER – Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner**GOD IS SEARCHING FOR YOU**

We are not orphans. We have a home. We have a Father who waits to receive us with joy – a running Father who is eager to give us the best robe, the best shoes, a ring, and a roast veal dinner with dancing to welcome us home. (Prodigal Son Parable)

So, if you fall, don't give up; get up and return to the Father. He will take you back, not as a criminal but as an honored guest! “For the Son of man came to seek and to save the lost,” said Jesus.

After Adam and Eve sinned, they were ashamed and hid from God. However, God is pictured as walking through the garden calling “Adam, where are you?” The rest of the Bible may be seen as a record of God's search.

Our task is not to search for God. The parables of the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the lost son show that God is already out searching for us. Our task, like that of the prodigal son, is to respond to God's search for us, to move out of the barnyard, to take the first step toward Him in repentance, faith, and commitment.

“As in Paradise, God walks in the Holy Scriptures, searching for man,” said St. Ambrose. It is not only in Holy Scriptures that God searches for us. He searches also through the voice of conscience; He searches for us through the sorrows and tragedies of life; He searches for us through the emptiness of life without Him. Yes, and even through your reading this meditation today, He searches and thirsts for your response, your repentance, your return.

Commit Your Cares to the Lord

Talk to God about whatever may be pressuring you and then commit the entire matter into His hands. Do this so that you will be free from the confusion, conflicts, and cares that fill the world today. In fact, anytime you are preparing to do something, undergoing some trial, or simply pursuing your normal business, tell the Father about it. Acquaint Him with it; yes, even burden Him with it, and you will have put the concerns and care of the matter behind you. From that point forward, exercise quiet, sweet diligence in your work, recognizing your dependence on Him to carry the matter for you. Commit your cares and yourself with them, as one burden, to your God.

THE DANGER OF DESPAIR

Try to not give in to despair. It is a dangerous temptation, because our Adversary Satan has refined it to the point that it is quite subtle. Hopelessness constricts and withers the heart, rendering it unable to sense God's blessings and grace. It also causes you to exaggerate the adversities of life and makes your burdens seem too heavy for you to bear. Yet God's plans for you, and His ways of bringing about His plans, are infinitely wise.

God's promises and His providence do not lift us from the world of common sense and daily trials. It is through these very things that our faith is perfected. It is in this world that God loves to interweave the golden threads of His love with the twists and turns of our daily experiences.
