God's Grace Strengthens Us

Our main concern with the dark fact of suffering is not to find an explanation: it is to find a victory. It is not to elaborate a theory; it is to lay hold upon a power, not so much the explaining of suffering, but grace and help to bear it. That is what God gives us in Christ.

A person who had tested the promise of God to the hilt in the worst tragedies of life, and therefore had a right to speak, spoke on this matter. He said that in all these things – these desolating heartbreaking things which happen to us, these physical pains, these mental agonies, these spiritual midnights of the soul – we are more than conquerors, not through our won strength or bravery, not through a philosophy, but "through Him Who loved us" – through the thrust and pressure of the invading grace of Christ.

That is the only answer to the mystery of suffering; and the answer is a question: Will you let God in to reign? The answer is not a theory. It is a life. It is a dedicated spirit, a fully surrendered soul. That is when God can take crushed flowers and produce perfume.

LEAVE YESTERDAY BEHIND

A popular saying offers this insight: "Yesterday is heavy. Put it down." It is a great reminder that we can become accustomed to carrying burdens we were never meant to carry. Yesterday's issues, problems, failures, regrets, confusions, and worries are not meant for today. Wisdom enables us to know the difference between what we should carry forward and what we should leave behind.

Yesterday is done and over. What can you do today, right now, that will lead to a better tomorrow? Right now is all we have. It is all we need to carry, and it is manageable.

FROM THE DESERT FATHERS

One does not bring the dust of the road into a room that one wishes to keep clean. Thus keep your heart free from gossip and chatter about the events of the day that is already past. Senseless talking is a great enemy of prayer.
