PASCHAL TROPARION: Christ is risen from the dead! By death he trampled death; and to those in the tombs he granted life.

ASCENSION THURSDAY

Forty days after Pascha (Easter) the resurrected Christ ascended into heaven. The forty days are mentioned in Acts 1:3. According to the gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, the ascension of the Lord took place on the Mount of Olives. The apostles all met the resurrected Christ. For forty days, he appeared to them and conversed with them, shared their meals, bestowed his peace on them and promised the gift of the Holy Spirit. Now they witness his glorious return to God the Father. Ascended into heaven, Christ sits at the right hand of the Father with the Holy Spirit.

Mary, Mother of Hope

It's not without reason then, that the holy Church, using the words of Sirach, calls Mary “the mother of holy hope” (see Sir 24:18). She is the mother who gives birth to holy hope in our hearts: not to the hope of the vain and transitory goods of this life, but of the immense and eternal goods of heaven.

Before the Divine Word took flesh in the womb of Mary, he sent an archangel to ask her consent, because he willed that the world should receive the incarnate Word through her, and that she should be the source of every good. For this reason, St. Irenaeus remarks that as Eve was seduced, by a fallen angel, to flee from God, so Mary was led to receive God into her womb, obeying a good angel. In this way, by her obedience, Mary repaired Eve's disobedience and became her advocate, and that of the whole human race. *-St. Alphonsus Liguori*

During Easter, we celebrate Jesus' resurrection and the promise of our own. What meaning can we find for ourselves in all of this?
