SCRIPTURE PRAYER - *May the Word of God dwell in our hearts and guide the actions of our lives.*

HEAVENLY TREASURE
We all have things we treasure. These things, probably, would be on the list of items we would try to remove from a house that is in the path of a flood. Because a vehicle can only contain so much – including the people who are in it – there are limited things that we could put in it. So stop for a moment and consider what items you would put in that vehicle if your home would be destroyed by a flood in an hour.
Too often we consider “things” to be our treasures, and Jesus warns against this in this passage: “Do not store up treasures for yourselves on earth, where moth and rust destroy them and thieves can break in and steal. But store up treasures for yourselves in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys them and thieves cannot break in and steal” (Matthew 6:19-20). In other words, we are to accumulate the virtues – those things which help us grow ever closer to God and our neighbor. These are treasures with which we can clothe ourselves for our journey into eternity!

A Good Choice
You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church....(Matthew 16:18)
Jesus picked Peter for a reason. The New Testament tells us Peter was every bit as awed as you or me. Could we have spent three years with Jesus, a close companion, a devoted disciple, and then, even after we were warned, publicly deny we ever knew him? Of course, we could. We are frail humans, and we will take every opportunity to save ourselves.
Peter gives us hope. He embodies all our faults and all our dreams of saintliness. Despite – or perhaps because of – his humanness, Peter is chosen by Jesus to establish his Church here on earth. He did not pick an elder in the temple, an expert on the Torah, a Scribe or Pharisee. Instead, he picked a simple fisherman, someone who could easily mix among other ordinary people, someone who could speak about Jesus in ways everyday people might understand. It was the perfect choice.
