DORMITION OF THE THEOTOKOS – August 15

Always in the Boat
Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion. They woke him and said to him, “Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?” (Mark 4:38)

We might easily get annoyed when someone doesn’t take a situation as seriously as we do. If we’re worried, we want others to be worried right along with us. But when the apostles were panicking, fearing for their lives, Jesus was sound asleep! How could he be so calm about the situation? The apostles were experienced fishermen. No doubt they had passed through their share of storms, so they knew that this was a severe one. They knew that they couldn’t handle the situation on their own. And so, they called on Jesus. The times that we most worry, when we panic and are most afraid, are usually the times when we have failed to put our faith in God. Jesus awoke and rescued the apostles.
No matter where we go, no matter what we’re facing, let’s not panic. Let’s recall our faith and remember that Jesus is always in the boat with us.

DEPEND ON GOD
Depending on God is not a cop-out; it’s a necessary disposition of the heart if we are to grow in spiritual maturity. In fact, the more childlike we become, the greater chance we have for holiness. Note: the goal is childlikeness, not childishness. There is a difference.
To change and become like children, we have to make some adult decisions. We need to decide to surrender our self-sufficiency in order to trust in God and his mercy. We need to make the decision to look for the goodness in others, forego deceit, and give God permission to purify our hearts.
All of these decisions will lead to a place of great dependence, just where God calls us to be. To become childlike is an adult decision which helps us to grow closer to God.
