EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS – September 14
This holy day is connected to the history of the huge basilica which was built over the place where Jesus was crucified and the place where He was buried. Both places are in different sections of the same church. It is known as the Church of the Holy Sepulchre (tomb). Located in Jerusalem, the church was dedicated on Sept. 13, 335. The next day, Sept. 14, a special ceremony was held inside the church to honor or exalt pieces of the cross of Christ which were discovered during the excavations involved in building the foundation of the church. This is the exaltation the holy day is referring to because it happened on Sept. 14. The Byzantine Emperor Constantine and his mother, St. Helen, were instrumental in determining the location and supervising the construction of this church in Jerusalem which still can be visited today.

Celebrities
[Jesus said:] “Not everyone who says to me, ‘Lord, Lord,’ will enter the Kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven.” (Matthew 7:21).

We are a celebrity-crazed society. Whether the celebrity is an actor, singer, sports figure, politician, religious leader or other achiever, we hold that person in awe. Even in the smaller circles where we spend our daily lives, there are “celebrities.” Jesus tells us, however, that all that really matters is doing God’s will.
For some, doing God’s will catapults them into celebrity status on earth. Most of us are called to do things that may not garner us accolades or awards but that contribute significantly to spreading God’s love in this world. God puts no value on our status in this world or on the earthly treasure we accumulate. Jesus came to call us to love God and one another. Regardless of our status or lot in life, this is all that matters. There is no greater role than to be God’s messenger of faith, love, and hope.

THE JOY OF THE CROSS
The Lord’s cross is not merely a nice artistic addition to our Churches, but is really a constant reminder of our faith in the Lord. It was through the cross that Jesus trampled down death by His own death and through the cross that joy has come into the world. It seems strange that the cross is referred to in terms of joy, but it is the joy of the cross which Paul and the other apostles preached so boldly. In his letter to the Colossians, Paul states that the cross brings reconciliation and peace, “For in Him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through Him to reconcile to Himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross” (Colossians 1:20). This statement echoes the passage in the Gospel of John where Jesus says that when the son of man is lifted up, he will draw all things to himself. Again, the cross brings about the unity of all, both Jew and Gentile, male and female, we all stand before Him as equals.
